The Treatment and Learning Center for children with Autism was founded in November of 2009 and has quickly become known throughout the south central region of the United States for the provision of best practice, high quality, applied behavior analysis, provided in a one-to one, intensive, clinical setting.

In our beautiful 5400 square foot clinic, our highly trained teachers and therapists, under the careful watch of board certified behavior analysts provide daily therapy, treatment and teaching to learners with autism and other disabilities. Our clinic includes seven classrooms, a large activity room, four bathrooms (offering plenty of room for LOTS of effective potty training), office space, a laundry room, a fully operational kitchen, a cafeteria, a play deck, and a large, fenced, yard. The clinic is located at 1710 West Front, in the heart of Tyler Texas, right next door to the nationally acclaimed, award winning, Tyler Municipal Rose Garden.

The philosophy of the Treatment and Learning Center is grounded in data-based scientific study of the best practices for children with autism. Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is the educational standard for children with autism. According to the philosophy of ABA, all people respond to their environments in predictable ways. Changes in behavior can be effected by changes in the environment, and TLC children are provided with the skills necessary to successfully navigate the changes in their social world. ABA insures that children can learn to engage in socially appropriate behavior and to reduce dangerous, socially inappropriate, or other challenging behavior through planned interactions with their environment. Programming at TLC is customized for each individual learner and is completely data-driven. Students are taught using procedures that have been proven to be the most effective for them individually. All procedures are prodigiously positive, with the goal of insuring that social interactions and other socially appropriate behavior are enjoyable for the student. As students learn a wider range of skills, (particularly communication skills which allow them the power of appropriately manipulating their environment without negative consequences), and as their abilities and options increase, they are far less likely to resort to challenging behavior and more likely to want to participate in

society to their fullest capabilities. TLC believes that through appropriate treatment each child can make great strides in social, communicative, behavioral and academic domains and that attained skills will be maintained and generalized in other settings outside of the clinic.
