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The Board-Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) is responsible for assessing, developing, and overseeing individualized Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) treatment plans to support individuals in achieving behavioral, social, and communication goals. The BCBA will supervise and train Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs) or other therapy staff, collect and analyze data, and collaborate with families, educators, and multidisciplinary teams to ensure effective program implementation.

Key Responsibilities:

- · Conduct functional behavior assessments (FBAs) and skills assessments
- Develop, implement, and monitor individualized treatment plans based on assessment results
- Collect and analyze behavioral data to guide treatment decisions
- Provide ongoing supervision, training, and performance feedback to RBTs or direct care staff
- Collaborate with families, caregivers, educators, and other professionals to ensure consistency and generalization of skills
- Maintain accurate, timely, and compliant documentation in accordance with ethical and professional standards
- Stay current on best practices, research, and professional guidelines in behavior analysis
- Ensure all services meet the requirements of the BACB Ethics Code and applicable funding/regulatory guidelines
